LOCAL RECEIVES BASE GRANT

The Kansas Department of Commerce, authorized by the SPARK Executive Committee, was offering to match funds to address economic development opportunities throughout the state. Building a Stronger Economy (BASE) is designed to support infrastructure development with the goal of expanding the base of businesses and residents.

We received word that Scott Mueller's Ninnescah LLC has been awarded \$750,000 through the BASE grant. These funds will be for the development of commercial and residential properties at 232 N Main in Kingman.



NEW EQUIPMENT AT EMS

Kingman EMS was awarded a \$29,900 grant for updated lifesaving equipment from the Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation. This grant allowed EMS to purchase a new battery-operated AMKUS extrication equipment, which would allow them to better serve the community. During the Spring Fling Health & Wellness Fair in April, they had the opportunity to show it off as well as their other rescue tools.

WHY CARE ABOUT INDEPENDENT, LOCALLY-OWNED BUSINESSES?

"Locally owned businesses play a central role in healthy communities and are among the best engines that cities and towns have for advancing economic opportunity and building resilient places. Small business ownership has been a pathway to the middle class for generations of Americans and continues to be a crucial tool for expanding prosperity and community self-determination.

Local small businesses are linked to higher incomes and less inequality.

Enacting policies that strengthen small businesses and expand opportunities for local entrepreneurs is one of the most effective ways of reducing inequality and expanding the middle class. In 2013, for example, an economist at the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta found that counties with larger shares of local small businesses outperform their peers on three critical economic indicators: they have stronger per capita income growth, faster employment growth, and lower poverty rates.

Local businesses foster community cohesion and well-being.

The social fabric of a community is tightly coupled with the health of its independent businesses. Research has shown that communities with a larger share of local businesses have more social capita, stronger social ties, higher levels of civic engagement, and better success solving problems.

Independent businesses generate more tax revenue at lower public cost. Locally owned businesses in dense, mixed-use commercial districts generate more tax revenue for cities than sprawling shopping centers, while also costing less in public services. An analysis from the Government Finance Review, drawing on data from a sample of 30 cities in 10 states, found that a community earns about \$7 in property taxes per acre on the average big-box retail store, compared to \$287 per acre on mixed-use, mid-rise business district. The compact nature of these districts also means they make more efficient use of public infrastructure and services."


